

## **CHARGING CUSTOMERS FOR LEGAL FEES**

### **Introduction**

1. Some banking corporations charge customers whom they are suing, for legal fees and other court costs, in connection with the court case and in the course of the process.

### **Time and amount of charge**

2. A banking corporation shall not charge customers or demand legal fees or other court costs from them in connection with a legal process until the conclusion of that process, and the amount shall be as determined by the court or other judicial authority as legal fees and court costs.

### **Execution**

3. Despite the aforesaid, in the course of the execution process, if specific legal fees have not been determined, the banking corporation is entitled to charge the customer for the minimum fee set under section 81 of the Chamber of Advocates Law, 5721–1961.
